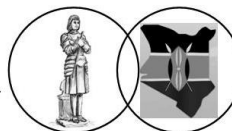

THE GUIDING HAND OF GOD

Fishing guides know where the fish bite. Tour guides know the best sites and their history. The guides that led wagon trains west in the 1800's had learned where the trails wound through mountain passes. Guides have knowledge valuable for what lies ahead. A guide looks toward the future in some way," writes Sister Joan Mitchell, C.S.J. in her *Sunday by Sunday* essay.

The guide whom Jesus promises will help his friends find their way and live out his principles after his physical presence ceases. The Spirit will sustain the community when the path through inevitable conflicts is not on the map. Jesus recognizes that he cannot prepare his followers fully for the future. They will have to "live into" the mystery of his death, resurrection, and return to God -- just as we all "live into" the mystery of radical transformation.

It is reported that people who face blindness find it very difficult to learn to use the white walking cane until their eyesight is completely gone. As long as one can see, one continues to depend on the eyes. Similarly, Jesus' friends discover the Spirit as their guide only in his absence. Perhaps we all experience the Spirit most fully after the loss of someone we love. Somehow, as we experience the memory and spirit of our loved one arising within us, we also become attuned to the Holy Spirit which is the love or relatedness between Creator, Son, and all that lives.

Because we live on the physical plane, it is necessary to remind ourselves of the Spirit's abiding presence in practical ways. Even the Book of Genesis refers to the Spirit as "the wind of God rippling the waters of the deep at creation."

An interesting more "modern" reminder might be the fingers on our hand: one finger -- three joints -- each joint enabling the finger to move. When the finger moves in unison with the other fingers, we can grasp and hold, create and protect, care for others and embrace them to our hearts.

Today's Feast of the Holy Trinity celebrates the many ways we see the Hand of God in our midst, the many ways we and our world are held in his loving embrace. We hold the Spirit as our walking stick -- guiding us safely through life's challenges and conflicts. We depend on the Spirit to help us grasp God's ways in good times and in difficult times. We open our hearts to God's creative presence -- the Spirit breathing in us today and always.
