SUMMER MASS SCHEDULE

Our Summer Mass Schedule with Sunday Masses at 8, 9:30 and 11 begins the first weekend of July and continues through Labor Day Weekend. The Vigil Mass is at 5 p.m. year-round.

COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION CHANGE

Beginning with the first weekend in July, we are implementing a change in the way communion is distributed at weekend Masses in order to accommodate the increased number of communicants during the summer months. The celebrant, deacon and two Eucharistic Ministers with hosts will be stationed in front of the altar on the lowest step, (and at the 930 Mass, a cup bearer will be at each end of the front step). This allows communicants using the center aisle to maintain a smooth flow to receive the host from one of the four EM's with hosts, (and then at the 930 Mass, either receive from the cup or return to the pew). Communicants from the side aisles will continue to receive as usual in either transept. Communion will be brought to those seated in the back who cannot come forward to receive at the altar.

Second Reading — If justification comes through the law, then Christ died for nothing (Galatians 2:16, 19-21).

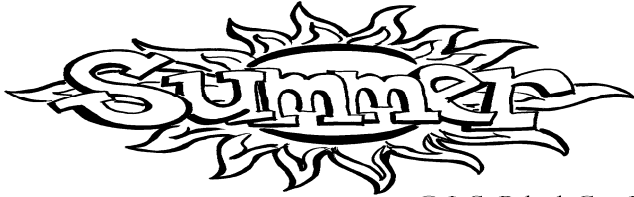

THE GRATEFUL GIVER

There is a Japanese folk tale about a very fine school that had outgrown its quarters. The master of the school approached many well-off townfolk asking if they might help. A merchant decided to donate five hundred pieces of gold toward the construction of a new school.

The merchant presented the bag of gold to the master. The master took the bag, but said nothing. The merchant was a bit put off by the master's apparent lack of gratitude. So, the merchant cleared his throat and hinted, "In that bag are five hundred pieces of gold."

"Yes," replied the master, "you told me that before."

"Even though I am a wealthy merchant, five hundred gold pieces is a lot of money," said the frustrated merchant.

The master asked matter-of-factly, "It is a lot of money. Do you want me to thank you for it?"

"Well, I think you should," the merchant responded.

But the master replied, "Why should I be thankful? It is the giver who should be thankful."

Like the merchant, the master's response may be confusing to us at first. But the school master teaches an important lesson about embracing a spirit of gratitude: gratitude is the realization of how much we have been given and that the true blessings of life are found in being able to give from our treasure rather than the possession of our treasure. Gratitude is the first response that we can make when we stand in awe before God's imponderable love for us.

The woman in today's Gospel becomes a model of such a grateful response of faith-filled praise for the forgiveness and compassion of God she has experienced in her life. In the light of God's presence in our midst, we realize both the treasures we possess and the emptiness we feel despite all the things that fill our lives. May we embrace gratitude as a practice of faith -- a practice which opens our minds and hearts to the joy of sharing our blessings with others, for by such giving we are blessed.
