MASS SCHEDULE CHANGES NEXT WEEKEND

Next weekend we begin our summer Mass schedule with Sunday Masses at 8:00, 9:30 and 11, continuing through Labor Day weekend. The Vigil Mass is at 5 p.m. year-round.

COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION CHANGE

Communion distribution procedures begin next weekend to accommodate the increased number of communicants during the summer months. The celebrant, deacon and two Eucharistic Ministers with hosts will be stationed in front of the altar on the lowest step, (and at the 930 Mass, a cup bearer will be at each end of the front step). This allows communicants using the center aisle to maintain a smooth flow to receive the host from one of the four EM's with hosts, (and then at the 930 Mass, either receive from the cup or return to the pew). Communicants from the side aisles will continue to receive as usual in either transept. Communion will be brought to those seated in the back who cannot come forward to receive at the altar.

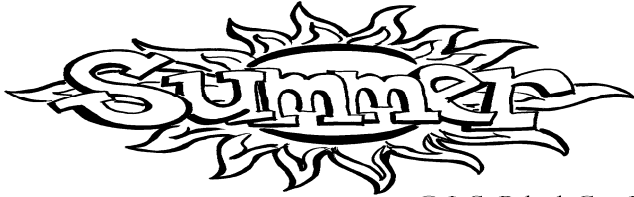

THE GRAND OPERATING PRINCIPLE

The Rev. Stephen Bauman is senior minister at Christ Church in New York. In his book, *Simple Truths: Our Values, Civility and Our Common Good*, Rev. Bauman writes about a meeting in his office with a young man who is feeling confused and conflicted about the decisions confronting him:

“He felt pretty clear about the sort of material success he was after, but uncertain about everything else. So I asked him what he thought he was committed to. What path did he think he was on -- could he describe it? He warned me that he wasn’t going after some sappy religious angle. Sappy or not, I countered that everyone has a religion. Everyone functions from a grand operating principle whether or not they admit it. Mostly that principle can be inferred by the wake they leave behind as they pass through life. The tangible content of our commitments tells the tale for all of us, notwithstanding what we say. I suggested he check out the wake he was currently leaving behind -- or if he was brave, ask a couple of others what they saw there. Did he want to hear the evidence of what his wake revealed?”

Jesus is asking that very same question in today’s Gospel: What is our “grand operating principle”; what are the values that we live, not just talk about? To realize our real commitments, our “true” religion, we must look at the harvest of our lives: our loves, our disappointments, our wealth, our poverty, what we have done, and what we hope to do. Are we at peace, fulfilled, happy at more than a superficial level?

We tend to think of faith as a series of “Thou shalt nots”, a list of things we promise to avoid to stay on God’s good side. But true discipleship embraces the “thou shalls”” the cultivation of justice and peace, compassion and forgiveness.

Jesus calls us forth asking total, unambiguous commitment to a spirit-centered perspective upon which we are willing to center our lives. We cannot be authentic followers of Christ by being mere spectators of God’s presence. We must become involved in the hard work of making the reign of God a reality.

Housing With Love Walk

The mini-walk will proceed along the bike path from St Joan's to West Road returning to St Joan's along the same route.

All proceeds from the walk go for housing assistance. There are no administrative expenses.

For the past 17 years, several organizations have banded together for a walk from Provincetown to Woods Hole to bring attention to the severe housing situation for those in need on Cape Cod. The St. Joan of Arc Conference is a participant, raising funds for the SVdP District Housing Fund. This fund in turn helps Parish Conferences to provide assistance to those facing foreclosure or eviction.

Last year, this Walk raised over \$96,000 in housing assistance for Cape families. The St Joan of Arc Conference raised about \$9,500.

This year our goal is \$10,000.

Vincetians will be collecting donations at the doors after each Mass next weekend.
