## **THE MUSIC OF HOPE**

In November of 2011 The Boston Globe had a story that told of a concentration camp near Prague called Terezin. Terezin was noted for being the camp of Jewish artists and musicians -- a forced labor camp where more than 30,000 died and 87,000 more were sent on to death camps. Prisoners at Terezin would meet secretly at night to make what music they could. Once discovered, the Nazis used this to their advantage by “staging” propaganda concerts for Red Cross officials.

Composers imprisoned at Terezin wrote many works that were performed by their fellow prisoners. The music reflects their experiences at the camp and the hope they clung to.

Twenty years ago, Mark Ludwig of the Boston Symphony read about the music created at Terezin and began a search for the lost music. After dozens of trips to the Czech Republic and searching through makeshift archives and attics, he found sheet music written in the prison camp.

Ludwig founded the Terezin Music Foundation which sponsors symposiums, organizes concerts, and commissions artists to complete and preserve the music of Terezin. Reconstructing, copying, and archiving this haunting music is much more than a hobby or an adventure for Mark Ludwig:

“For me,” writes Mark, “this has been a spiritual mission. First, this music was and remains unbelievable. Second, these people’s lives were destroyed . . . but they found the will to continue their craft and continue to make and perform music in the worst possible circumstances. And that needs to be remembered.”

Mark Ludwig’s work to preserve the music of Terezin mirrors the prophetic ministry of Jesus in proclaiming the compassion and healing of the Father’s kingdom. In the Gospel, Jesus’ journey to proclaim the coming of God’s reign among us is chronicled by the evangelist, Mark. In the preserved music of Terezin, Mark Ludwig and his colleagues save for the world works of great hope that witness the triumph of justice over hatred and hope over despair.

As disciples of Jesus in our own time and in our own place, we are called to do that same work. For us, as for Mark Ludwig, the Spirit within us calls us on a spiritual mission: to proclaim God’s presence in our midst, to be agents of healing, and to enable God’s grace to bring restoration to struggling and despairing hearts.
